
In 1981, Ed joined HP Optoelectronics Division on Page Mill Road in Quality. Did a stint in Product Development of AlGaAs material evaluation and on a Center High Mount Stop Light for automobiles. Went back to Quality and worked on Fiber Optic products. In 1987, I moved to HP Corporate Quality and covered Components, Computers, Instruments, Printers, Medical in Quality/Reliability/Environmental Test. In 1993, with HP support, I participated in standards development work through the International Electro technical Commission (IEC) in their Technical Committees on Test Methods (TC75) and on Environment Conditions (TC50) which later joined together as TC104. In 1997, I became the Chair of TC 104.

In 1999, Agilent Technologies spun off from HP, carrying with it, me and the Instruments, Optoelectronics and Medical Groups. I continued to work in Corporate Quality and my work expanded to include Product Regulations.

In 2005, Ed retired from IEC work and then Agilent and immediately found volunteer work in IEEE.

Ed is currently Chair of the IEEE Santa Clara Valley Chapter of CPMT and Vice-Chair of the Santa Clara Valley Section and Vice-President of the Silicon Valley Engineering Council.

My wife, Pat, and I enjoy the visits by and with our grand-children (Logan, Tani and Derek) as well as our daughter, Ellen and son, Paul.
